Through prints, publications, objects or drawings, Kari works with political comments and themes as vulnerability and strategies for survival. It is about being able to find meaning in the absurd and meaninglessness, and to survive in a chaotic, irrational and threatening world.


**KAMIL KAK**  
Kamil is an interdisciplinary artist working with installation, video-performance, textile and printmaking. Through their image-making, craft and technology, analogue techniques for printmaking with artists of systems, analogues and performance. They explore social-political themes in Europe and Norway, to comment on the radical shift in recent decades. They currently project centres on The Machine, a wooden press he designed and built from scratch. The Machine can be used to generate large-scale prints employing wooden rollers as interchangeable matrices.

**ENRIQUE GUADARRAMA SOLIS**  
Enrique's artistic practice is an exploration of systems, analogue image-making, craft and technology. His work connects traditional printmaking with artistic objects, sculpture, installation and performance. His current project centres on The Machine, a wooden press he designed and built from scratch. The Machine can be used to generate large-scale prints employing wooden rollers as interchangeable matrices.

**NICHOLAS FOX**  
Shampoo Loves Shape & Colors.  
Nicholas' work is a graphic exploration of time, personal and collective memory, and narrative. In her recent work she explores conceptual and symbolic understandings of home and identity through printmaking. Her work consists mainly of reduction woodcut, transforming two-dimensional prints into three-dimensional sculptures she calls graphic objects. She cuts, folds and arranges prints of houses with additional collages to display personal childhood stories from within.

**DEBANGONA PAUL**  
Debangona explores printmaking through her expressive practice of line, color and large-scale fiber boards. She is committed to a holistic totality of art. In essence, her inner soul, art and life are inseparable.

**ANNA WEILHARTNER**  
Anna's practice experiments with books through binding, format, sequence and public art. She explores how paintings and prints can become one-of-a-kind books or book sculptures. Current events and urgencies such as climate change, the pandemic and social dumping, inform her artwork. Whilst some books invite participation or have a cross-disciplinary approach, each follows its own rules and sources of inspiration.
